
Crucial Concerns: Sea Levels & Marine Life Extinction

Global warming can truly disturb marine life and its habitat. Greenhouse gases that are released by human activities trap more energy from the sun, causing the oceans to absorb more heat. This increases in sea surface temperatures. The warming of ocean water raises the sea level as water expands on heating.




Because of human activity, there is an increased level of carbon dioxide (CO₂) in the atmosphere. This means more CO₂, which is acidic, is dissolving into the ocean. The ocean's average pH now is around 8.1, which is basic. But as the ocean continues to absorb more CO₂, the pH will decrease and the ocean will become more acidic. Higher ocean acidity makes it more difficult for certain organisms, such as corals and shellfish, to build skeletons and shells.



Sea ice loss has far-reaching effects around the world. Polar ice caps are melting since global warming causes climate change. We are currently losing Arctic sea ice at a rate of almost 13% per decade. Over the past 30 years, the oldest and thickest ice in the Arctic has declined by a stunning 95%. The melting glaciers and sea ice add to the rising ocean levels. This is a threat to structures built near the coastline worldwide.

The melting ice caps play a significant role in the loss of habitat. Ocean warming slows the formation of sea ice, quickening its decline and thinning ice sheets. Polar bears and other Arctic marine mammals are losing their habitat and food sources due to sea ice decline. Aquatic life like Hawksbill Turtle and Blue Whale are endangered
